



Almost half of U.S. motor vehicle fatalities occur on rural roads, but only 19% of the nation's population lives in rural areas. A new GHSA and State Farm report found that risky driving behaviors contributed significantly to the problem. The report's author will share the findings of an analysis of five years of Fatality Analysis Reporting System data and highlight the unique challenges posed by rural roads. 
